

## **Court Of Appeal**



### **High Court**

(1) Formal address –"The Chief Justice"Or"Mr Justice X""Mrs Justice X"

(2) In court:-

"My Lord or My Lady"

(3) In judgements:-

"Roberts C.J. X - J."

### **Intermediate Court**

(1) Formal address -

"Judge X"

(2) In Court -

"Your Honour"

(3) In judgments -

"Judge X"

# **Magistrates' Courts**

(1) Formal address -

"Mr X, or Mrs X."

(2) In Court –

"Your Honour"

(3) In Judgments -

"Mr X, Magistrate or Mrs X, Magistrate"

### **Registrars**

(1) Formal address -

"Mr X (Registrar) or Mrs X (Registrar)".

(2) In Chambers -

"Sir" or "Madam".

(3) In judgments -

"X, Registrar".
