

LEGAL AID CLINIC

The Committee which is considering this problem hopes to report early in 1998.

Copies of the report should be sent to the A.G. as well as to the C.J..

It is to be noted that the Attorney-General regards any reference of cases to his Chambers for possible legal aid as misleading. This ought to be borne in mind by the Committee when furnishing its report.

There is no financial backing for the scheme, or any provisions for secretaries or interpreters. These matters will be dealt with in the report.

The C.J. asked members of the profession to refer to the A.G. any complaints about delays in either Registry.

OTHER COMMITTEES

The C.J. said that, as far as he knew, action had not yet been taken by Mr Teo to tender a report on advertising or by the C.R., to revive the Committee on contingency fees.

OTHER BUSINESS

There had still been no reply from the A.G. about bringing the list of Commissioners for Oaths up to date.
