### **IMPORTANT NOTES:**

1. Counsel appearing in matters herein listed are reminded that the allocated dates are liable to change.
2. All relevant bundles and documents are to be properly arranged and paginated, and are required to be filed with the Registrar not less than twenty-one (21) clear days before the start of the Court of Appeal session. Failing to comply will result in non-acceptance by the Registry.
3. All bundles and documents that are to be used before the Court are to be submitted as follows:
  - a. One soft copy through the Court of Appeal Registry e-mail: **court of appeal judges@judicial.gov.bn**; and
  - b. Four hard copies/printed copies submitted to the Registry. The hard copies will be returned to Counsel upon the conclusion of the appeal.
4. All relevant bundles and documents are to be properly arranged, labeled and paginated and indexed.
5. For criminal appeals, the following documents are to form the 'Appeal Bundle' which will be prepared by the Registry. The following documents are to be submitted (if available) and ought to be properly arranged, labeled, paginated, indexed and appear in the following order:
  - a. Notice of Appeal
  - b. Petition or Grounds of Appeal
  - c. Record of Appeal
  - d. Submissions
  - e. Bundle of Authorities
  - f. Charge sheet or the amended charge sheet
  - g. Statement of Facts from the Court below
  - h. Admitted Facts under Section 117c of the Criminal Procedure Code
  - i. Judgment from the Court below
  - j. Notes of Proceedings
  - k. Grounds of Sentence
  - l. List of Previous Convictions
  - m. Warrant of Committal
6. Counsel are required to inform the Registrar immediately upon the publication of the cause list if any of the matters listed are likely to be settled, so that other matters may be listed instead.

7. Parties are to take note that written submissions shall not exceed 5,000 words and to state the total number of words at the conclusion of the submission. When the appeal is a criminal appeal against sentence, the limit shall be 3,000 words (Chief Justice Practice Direction No. 2 of 2019).
8. Parties are to take note of Chief Justice Practice Direction No. 1 of 2023 wherein authorities may only be referred to in the following manner for both civil and criminal appeals:
  - a. The proposition or principle being advanced or relied upon shall be stated in an outline with a reference to the title only of the authorities relied upon and it shall appear on the front page of the Bundle of Authorities (with the relevant page reference or headnote);
  - b. Only those parts of the authority which it is submitted support the stated proposition or principle may be annexed to the party's written submission. Parties are to take full responsibility in keeping their contents within reasonable bounds and exercise restraint. It should only include the cases which are likely to be referred to during an oral argument.
